Dr. da Fonseca received his dental degree at the Federal University of Juiz de Fora, Brazil, in 1987. He went on to the University of Minnesota, Minneapolis, for his Master of Science degree and certificate in Pediatric Dentistry, followed by a fellowship at the Denver Children's Hospital. In 1994-95, he did an Oral Medicine fellowship at the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center in Seattle working exclusively with hematopoietic stem cell transplant children. He was a clinical assistant professor and director of undergraduate pediatric dentistry at the University of California, San Francisco (1995-97). At the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor (1997 to 2005), he was director of the pediatric dental service at the University Medical Center. He was director of inpatient dental care at Nationwide Children's Hospital and a clinical professor at the Ohio State University College of Dentistry (2005-2010). He is the editor of the Journal of Dentistry for Children, a publication of the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry. He recently co-edited the book "Clinical cases in Pediatric Dentistry". He is currently Law-Lewis Professor and director of the pediatric dental graduate program at the University of Washington Center for Pediatric Dentistry and Seattle Children's Hospital. Starting July 2016, Dr. da Fonseca will be chair and graduate program director of the department of Pediatric Dentistry at the University of Illinois at Chicago.
